

# ANTHROPOLOGY--3 YEAR PLANNING TOOL

**NOTES:** The Anthropology major is somewhat flexible--this is one suggested plan that assumes no ANTH transfer cr has been applied. Internships are strongly encouraged and count toward ANTH/SOAN elective credit. Courses taken during required semester abroad may count toward the major; planning is essential. Jan term is an option for completing ANTH electives and LC courses. Students can declare their major once they've connected with an ANTH faculty who can serve as their advisor.
