## First Semester Seminar Structure Overview




## Terminology

First Semester Seminar

- IDST 007 First Semester Seminar (FSS) Group Advising Meetings with Advising Course faculty and their first-year advisees (Thursdays at 12pm).
- IDST 007L First Semester Seminar Lab (FSS Lab) Peer group meetings with Registration & Orientation Leaders (Monday nights).
- ROG (Registration & Orientation Group) A group of about 22-24 students lead by a Registration & Orientation Leader (ROL) who has been in contact with them since May; ROGs meet to complete First Semester Seminar Lab (Monday nights).
- ROL (Registration & Orientation Leader) The peer who leads their ROGs through First Semester Seminar Lab on Monday nights.

## ROL/Staff Advisor/Faculty Advisor student support

2023 updates to the registration process

- Based on feedback from last year's faculty, ROL and student FSS surveys, outreach and support to incoming students was amended to play to everyone's strengths:
  - ROLs serve as peer support—building belonging, communicating/checking in with students throughout their transition to Linfield
  - Staff Advisors serve as initial schedule advisors—after reviewing students' application info and advising profile info, staff advisors sent emails with customized fall schedule recommendations
  - Faculty Advisors serve as final fall schedule advisors—after reviewing students' schedules in Self-Service, faculty advisors meet 1-1 with students to recommend adjustments and strategies for their first semester success

#### First Semester Seminar Structure

#### **Advising (ADV course)**

- Selected by student
- Taught by faculty who is also their First Semester Seminar instructor
- When no ADV courses selected, student paired with faculty advisor based on their other course selections

## First Semester Seminar (IDST\*007)

- Taught by faculty who have agreed to add first-year advisees to their roster
- Provides consistent firstyear advising structure for all students in IDST\*007
- Meets 5 times total (4 groups + 1 one-on-on)

## First Semester Seminar Lab (IDST\*007L)

- Led by ROL, focused on building community and awareness of campus resources
- Meets 8 times total (7 groups + 1 one-on-one)



### First Semester Seminar Structure—add'l context

All First-Year Students are enrolled in IDST\*007 and IDST\*007 & are paired with a faculty advisor

Most First-Year students are enrolled in an Advising course

Some First-year students are enrolled in a non-ADV designated subject and have been paired with a faculty advisor based on those registration preferences

If you have students in your IDST\*007 section who are <u>not</u> in one of your courses, we recommend adding a meeting with them in September to get to know them outside of IDST\*007

- One-on-one or in small groups (if you have a larger section)
- Somewhere central and casual—Starbuck's, outdoors, a common area—you decide

## **IDST Syllabus Review**

- Syllabus with calendars for both IDST and Monday Lab Sessions
- Emphasis on Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes
- Attendance
  - Attendance policy is up to you.
  - We suggest that students should attend at least ~75% of meetings: 4/5 ADV meetings and
     6/8 Labs
- Policies page may need to be updated based on personal preferences and Covid
- Description of Assignments have been removed. Titles of assignments remain
  - Description of each individual assignment can be found in your SharePoint folder



## The Five Advising Meetings for IDST

- Friday, August 25: Group meeting in IDST Room and 1:1 Sessions
  - Joining the Linfield Community and 1:1 Advising/Check-In Sessions
- August 31 (Week 1): Group Session
  - What to expect in your first semester, Linfield Curriculum, Liberal Arts, etc.
- September 21 (Week 4): Group Session
  - Exploring academic interests; Preparing for 1:1 advising
- October (Weeks 8-10): 1:1 Sessions
  - 1:1 Advising and check-in
- November 16 (Week 12): Group Session
  - Debrief registration, review academic program declaration process, add/drop process

## Week 1 Meeting: August 31

- Check in: confusions/concerns in first week of classes
- Adjusting to college
- Time management (they will also learn about this with Learning Support Services)
- Catch up on Liberal Arts and the Linfield Curriculum (LCs)
- Introduce "Take Faculty to Lunch" Assignment

## Week 4 meeting: September 21

- Check in
- Students report on "Take a Faculty Member to Lunch" assignment (if assigned)
- Exploring and choosing a major
- What do you do if you got an Academic Alert?
- Developing a four-year academic plan
- Preparing for advising meetings
- Introduce "Major Investigation/Academic Plan" assignment (faculty determine logistics of when and how students turn these in if assigned)



## Weeks 8-10: One-on-One meetings

- Check in (academics, life, etc.)
- January Term and Spring Registration
- Encourage students to build an Academic Plan or Schedule before meeting
- Refer student to meet an advisor in major of interest
- Review Self-Service and Advisor Approval for Registration process as needed (ROLs will also remind students)
- Build a personal connection with students

## Week 12 meeting: November 16

- · Check in
- Discuss the Declaration of Major process
- Preparing for finals
- Process for adding / dropping courses
- Go over final assignment: Reflection

- "View new program" option for "what if" scenarios
- Search for course that fulfill LCs
