- All tuition and fee estimates are based upon enrollment in 12-18 credits of coursework.
- Room and Board estimates are based upon living in a double room on-campus and enrollment in the meal plan, as required of all Freshmen.
- Upon acceptance of Linfield admission, international students are required to submit a \$400 matriculation fee, as well as a \$1600 deposit, which will count towards the first semester's tuition.
- > Students who will be living off campus with dependents (spouse or children) will need to provide documentation of an additional \$7500 per dependent for an F-2 I-20 to be issued.
